Berkeley Lab Scientist Proposes Solution to Reduce Developing World's Expensive, **Polluting Fuel-Based Lighting**

BERKELEY, CA - The use of highly-efficient, cost-effective white light-emitting diodes as a

replacement for inefficient, polluting kerosene lamps common in the developing world, could potentially save tens of billions of dollars per year worldwide, according to a scientist at the U.S. Department of Energy's Lawrence Berkeley National Laboratory (Berkeley Lab).

A D V E R T I S I N G

Evan Mills, of Berkeley Lab's Energy Environmental Technologies Division, notes in an article in the May 27, 2005 issue of the journal Science that more than 1.6 billion people have no access to electricity, and many others have only intermittent access. As a result, who can illumination when it's dark rely on lamps that burn kerosene, diesel, propane, biomass-based fuels.

In his Science article, Mills proposes a lighting option that developing nations might use to reduce the cost of providing effective, cleaner lighting to their citizens. "As they modernize, developing countries can select better technologies, and in so doing surpass levels of efficiency typical of industrialized nation. The latest improvement is the solid-state white light-emitting diode [WLED]." In recent years, R&D performed by private industry as well as the Department of Energy has made these light sources suitable for task illumination.
